

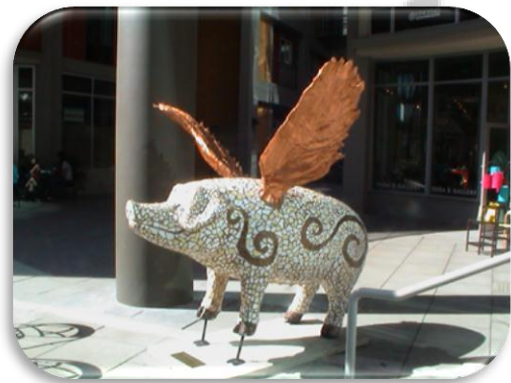
Wildlife Seminar

The “Hudson River Miracle” alerted many to the dangers of wildlife in a most dramatic way. However, for those engaged in “Wildlife Hazard Management and Control”, this was justification of the efforts made over numerous years to mitigate this hazard to aviation.

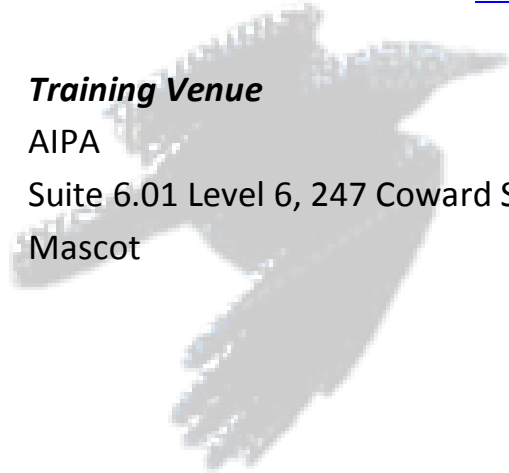
